It just evolved as we continually hired the best skilled people we could find. “

“As an immigrant myself, this country has given me so much – it just seemed right somehow to create opportunity for other newcomers.” Nienkämper said. “We have a flag wall to acknowledge the diverse cultures we represent.”

The Nienkämper workforce represents almost 30 different countries of origin including China, Croatia, Equador, Italy, Guyana, Haiti, India, Peru, Poland and many others. Not only is the company ethnically diverse, but it has a formal Employment Equity program as well.

With many long-service employees, Nienkämper stays at the forefront in employment practices. This is reflected in a remarkably low turnover rate. It provides employees with time off to mark unique cultural or religious observances including Chinese New Year, Yom Kippur, Ramadan and others. Investing in training, Nienkämper offers both apprenticeships and co-op placements. It has also formed partnerships with many local school boards, community colleges and national art institutions and provides numerous scholarships and internships.

Nienkämper is focused on creating a workplace and public environments where people can realize their full potential. The company occupies a sprawling 120,000 square foot facility in north Toronto that houses state-of-the-art furniture manufacturing equipment, much of it customized to meet Nienkämper's demanding design standards.
